Concern brought to the A3 Team:

The wrestling program would like to add 6th graders to the Middle School wrestling team.

Concern initiated by: Jon Murray

Considerations:

The 2015-2016 school year was the Middle School's first year competing in IESA wrestling. A-3 has asked for feedback regarding adding 6th graders to the team from the GMS Athletic Directors as well as the GMS BLT. A-3 met with Jon Murray, John Petrov, and Travis Mackey on April 14th and discussed financial needs and their wrestling vision. No additional coaches would be needed. Adding 6th graders is a need in the eyes of the coaches because of the inability to fill the weight classes.

A3 recommendation:

For wrestling only and so long as it's a need and will not infringe extra costs on the District, A-3 recommends that 6th graders be able to participate on the Middle School IESA team. GMS BLT – Response to 6th Grade Wrestling inquiry from A3 (initiated from Jon Murray, GHS Varsity Wrestling Coach)

A review of the request for 6th grade wrestling at GMS was conducted from November 1st through March 1st, and included feedback from the GMS Athletic Directors, GMS Administration, and the GMS BLT. There are many positives to adding opportunities for students like a wresting program at 6th grade, including increased student involvement, program (wrestling) extension, and academic success related to increased involvement. The GMS BLT also has the following concerns with adding 6th grade sports, specifically wrestling:

- 1.) There is a larger question on school-based sports that we would like to review further, specifically on the topic of the 6th grade child development. The GMS BLT will look at this question to see if it is a viable goal for 16-17.
- 2.) After review with our Heartland Conference Athletic Directors, and the conference Bi-laws, "The Heartland Conference does not allow 6th grade participation in sporting events..." the only exception was Cross Country, where a student in 6th grade can be on the team but can not participate in any MS Varsity meet for points.
- 3.) If we did allow for wrestling at 6th grade, which other sports will be considered for participation at 6th grade as well? There is an equity question that was discussed and would come up from students, parents, and coaches in basketball, track, cross country, and volleyball.
- 4.) Title 9, male and female event opportunities, would need to be reviewed carefully to ensure compliance with the law, and ensure the fairness in opportunity for both sexes.
- 5.) Financial costs are a factor, and any consideration of adding an activity would need to be reviewed with District Finance to review actual costs as related to overall funding.

If this request would benefit from further study, the GMS BLT is requesting that the A3 team complete a 3-year review of 6th grade sport opportunities, using both positive impact surveys and reviews, and collecting feedback on the concerns topics above.
