Both Northside and Southwest have achieved recognition for distinguished achievement on state tests. Here is the text from Dr. Koch. Northside and Southwest have been designated with Academic Excellence Awards. While the District strives to focus much more diligently on our own curricular and instructional excellence, it is wonderful to receive such validation externally when compared to peer schools.

"This week we are honoring the 834 schools that have been named to the 2010 Illinois Honor Roll. These schools are being singled out for making academic progress and the Honor Roll includes 71 schools that are being recognized for their seventh or eighth year. The 2010 Honor Roll includes schools from 364 districts statewide, with downstate schools representing 45 percent of the Honor Roll Schools, suburban schools representing 43 percent and Chicago schools representing 12 percent. In total, there were 852 awards this year in three categories.

- Spotlight Schools Recognizes 300 high-poverty, high-performing schools that are beating the odds to overcome the achievement gap.
- Academic Excellence Awards 459 schools have sustained high performance over at least three years.
- Academic Improvement Awards 93 schools are showing substantial improvement.
