

American National Government (Dual Credit)

Targeted Grade Levels: 11th Graders

About the Course: This course explores the structure and function of the United States government, including the historical development and evolution of the Constitution. Students will study the organization, powers, and responsibilities of the three branches of government, the workings and limitations of the American political system, and how federal, state, and local governments interact within that system.

Rationale For The Course: Offering Dual Credit American Government gives students the chance to earn both high school and college credit. The course builds college readiness, provides transferable credit, and supports our goal of expanding rigorous opportunities that prepare students for success beyond high school.

Benefits Of The Course:

- 1. Replicates the semester format of college courses
- 2. Multiple assessment opportunities to demonstrate mastery of course learning objectives
- 3. Dual Credit vs College Board Credit at the college level

Agriculture Leadership

Purpose:

- Develop leadership and communication skills
- Apply those skills within agriculture, FFA, and community settings

About the Course:

- Focuses on leadership in food, fiber, and natural resources industries
- Combines classroom learning, FFA activities, and SAE projects
- Students practice leadership, not just learn about it
- Builds skills in:
 - Communication
 - Teamwork
 - · Decision-making
 - Problem-solving

Benefits:

- Strengthens public speaking, communication, and interpersonal skills
- Promotes teamwork, initiative, and responsibility
- Builds confidence and leadership experience through FFA and community involvement
- Encourages critical thinking and problem-solving in real agricultural contexts
- Prepares students for future leadership and team-based roles in agriculture, business, and beyond
- Develops soft skills needed in all careers
- Emphasizes working effectively in team settings

Basic Art for Special Education Students 9-12

Overview: A foundational, hands-on art course designed for students who benefit from a slower-paced and supportive environment.

Rationale: Students in Life Skills and Cross-Categorical programs often struggle with the pace and vocabulary of general education art classes. Basic Art will provide equal access to the visual arts by adapting materials, pacing, and expectations to meet diverse learning needs while maintaining focus on creativity, communication, and Benefits: *Encourages self-expression and creativity. confidence. *Builds fine motor and problem-solving skills. *Promotes social interaction and teamwork. *Fosters cultural awareness and appreciation. *Provides a safe space for students to express emotion and ideas visually, building self esteem and self awareness. *Bridges the gap between middle school adapted art \(\) and post secondary goals by fostering independence and creativity.

Positive Psychology

Targeted Grade Levels: 11th and 12th Graders

About the Course: Positive Psychology and Leadership is a semester course that helps students understand the science of well-being, resilience, and human strengths. Students learn strategies for developing a growth mindset, practicing gratitude and mindfulness, managing stress, and building leadership skills. Through hands-on activities and personal projects, they apply these concepts to improve their own well-being and positively influence others in school and the community.

Rationale For The Course: Positive Psychology helps students build resilience, well-being, and leadership skills through topics like gratitude, mindset, and stress management. The course focuses on growth and happiness, giving students lifelong tools for success in school, careers, and life.

Benefits Of The Course:

- -Helps students build skills that can be applied in their lives regardless of future paths o circumstances
- -Especially beneficial to the career paths of many Geneseo students (farmers, small business owners, upper management, teachers, etc.)
- -Able to apply the concepts immediately to benefit the culture of the GHS & community as a whole.
- -The content, projects, and book study provide a unique opportunity not currently present in many high school curriculums.

Preparing 11th & 12th Graders for a High-Demand Career

Core Curriculum

- Aircraft Systems (UAS).
- Safe Operations: Mastering safe flight procedures and FAA regulations.
- Technical Skills: Hands-on drone maintenance and servicing.
