Obstacles:



VOLLEYBALL: Our current conference does not follow the IESA calendar for Volleyball or Basketball (both boys and girls).

*Softball is not a fall high school sport. Therefore, athletes should not have to choose between softball and volleyball at the middle school level. We would collaborate with volleyball to ensure as many athletes can compete in both when desired.

*Golf, Cross Country, Volleyball, and Football are all fall sports at the middle school and high school level.

Practice/Schedule

- *The first year, we would have 5-10 scheduled games, with the possibility of a few B games.
- *Home games and practice would take place at JFE. The fields are owned by the school district, so no cost.
- *Practice: For girls that are participating in volleyball, they might only practice a few times a week. Parents would be required to transport their athlete to practices.
- *No cuts, however depending on the busing situation, everyone might not travel to away games. 18 are allowed on the Postseason Roster.
