Comparative Grade Data, 17-18 to 18-19

Overall improvement for all 3 grades = 62 core classes out of 148 classes had improved grades; 42%

Student Improvement: - 2 students improved in ALL 4 core classes = 5% - 11 students improved in 3 or more core classes = 30% - 17 students improved in 2 or more core classes = 46%

Overall student improvement: —— *33 out of 37 students improved in at least 1 core class = <u>89%</u>

 - 8 of the original will continue the program 2nd semester


• Program Promotion:

 - 1 full-time student added after mid-term quarter 2


• Program Successes:


Quarter 1 Grades




7th Grade SAS Study Hall Semester 1 Report

- Program Student Demographics:
 - 7 original full-time, 2 additional full-time, 7 part-time, 16 total
 - 5 of the original will continue the program 2nd semester
- Program Promotion:
 - 2 full-time students dismissed at the end of semester 1
 - 2 full-time students promoted to part-time for quarter 3
- Program Additions:
 - 2 full-time students added after quarter 1
 - 7 part-time band/choir students added after quarter 1
 - 1 band/choir switching to full-time for semester 2
 - 1 possible addition for another full-time student at start of semester 2
- Program Successes:
 - Students are utilizing their planners and checking grades daily
 - Many of these students utilize their time wisely during 4th hour
 - All of the band/choir students are no longer at risk for retention and have improved with reducing their missing work
- Program Issues:
 - Balancing work time vs. study skill lessons




Quarter 1 Grades

Quarter 2 Grades




Missing Assignments

Student AA Growth



8th Grade SAS Study Hall Semester 1 Report


- Program Student Demographics:
 - 9 original, 7 currently, 12 total
 - 5 of the original will continue the program 2nd semester
- Program Promotion/Removal:
 - \circ 4 promoted due to success
 - \circ 1 removed due to behavior
- Program Additions:
 - 3 students were added during 1st Semester (one of those has already been promoted at end 1st semester).
- Program Successes:
 - Students are utilizing their planners daily and checking grades twice a week
 - Many of these students utilize their time wisely during 3rd hour
- Program Issues:
 - Jump in rigor and expectations from quarter 1 to quarter 2
 - Extended absences due to illness






Student BC was retained last year. He is aware that Sci Tech is not a core class and is not used for determination of promotion to High School. BC has openly discussed with teachers that he will spend his time focusing on the core subject areas in order to guarantee best chances for promotion.





While the number of D's and F's have increased 2nd quarter, the 8th grade curriculum is much more labor intensive during 2nd quarter. There is an increase in the number of assignments that students are required to complete, which impacted students' overall grades. Grades shown here are only for the 7 original students who remained in SAS study hall for all of semester 1.



Missing Assignments (for original 7 who remained in SAS all semester)

2 of the 7 students account for 14 of the missing homework assignments in weeks 6-11. These students had several absences and are struggling with staying current while making up past work.
