Geneseo High School has seen increased participation in Athletics this fall. Our total number of athletes currently in a Fall sport is 398 out of 887 total students (45%). This is a trend that has continued over the course of many years (beyond the three listed) as we focus on multi-sport participation.

We work very hard to provide the best coaches possible for our student-athletes and can be limited by the amount we can pay them if we spread those stipends over multiple people. Student-to-Coach ratio is something we keep an eye on and have been fortunate to keep fairly low.
