We made it! And I am truly so happy to have the team of nurses we have to support and care for the needs of our medically diverse student population and staff.

As I mentioned last year, the increase in medical acuity within our schools continues to grow and at an alarming rate, mental health concerns/needs are a constant part of our roles here. Having the team that I do with GMS's counseling department, that help with way more than academics, our social worker, and SRO has helped tremendously for these students. It would be so helpful if these supports were available at all buildings as it truly is a team effort to keep these students healthy and safe enough to learn.

This year the state of Illinois passed a new law, HB 5394, stating all schools must have a Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP) in place by January 1st, 2025. I helped to write our district plan, submitted and then I presented it to staff and gave them all the opportunity to try CPR, on mannequins, on an institute day. The law reads this education must be given each school year within the first 30 days of school starting and we have already begun working on a plan for that for new staff and returning staff for the upcoming school year. The link below will take you to our district's CERP.

This year we have welcomed Andrea Smith to Northside. Her years of experience have proven to be incredibly valuable here. We have recently hired a new substitute nurse that is willing to work for us when needed on her days off from the hospital. We are so thankful when we find nurses that are willing to give their time to help us as it is quite rare to come by when most nurses are already working full time elsewhere and we hope to find a few more to help us when we need it.

Deb Rokis, Helen Johnston, & Diana Wallace helped us meet the state requirements for vision and hearing. Combined they completed a total of 835 vision and 1,169 hearing screenings. We cannot thank them enough for their continuation with helping us meet this requirement. Next year I will be looking into sending two school nurses that are currently here to complete the vision and hearing certifications to give us more options and back ups should any of them not be able to continue.
