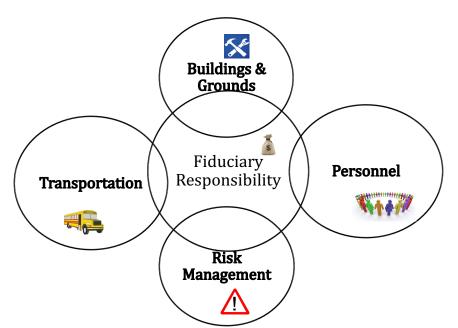
Superintendent Report 4/8/22

Updates from around the district and the state.

- 1. Thursday, April 14 will mark our 151st consecutive day of student attendance and leave just 24 school days left in the school year. Students have either just finished, or will shortly, the required state assessments. GHS is planning on having graduation outside on Sunday, May 22 at 3:00, with the parade starting at 1:00.
- 2. Our COVID-related metrics continue to hold at a low level. For the week of March 28-31, we had zero (0) reported cases! Updated numbers can be found on our <u>website</u>.
- 3. Spring sports (baseball, track and field, soccer, tennis, and softball) are in full swing at GMS and GHS.
- 4. Summer school plans are finalized. In your packet, you will find details provided by Mrs. Boone.
- 5. The Board of Education held a Special Meeting on Thursday, March 24 to review bids for the new Career and Technical Education Center. I am pleased to announce that the BOE accepted the bids and the project will continue to move forward with the scheduled work. Groundbreaking will occur this fall.
- 6. Regarding personnel for 2022-23, I am happy to share that all known vacant teaching positions have been filled. This is no small feat given the current teacher shortage and competitive recruiting of every district across the country.
- 7. Regarding certain agenda items, here is additional, more specific information:
 - a. GMS Softball proposal: Jenni Johnson has prepared a short presentation for the BOE to consider adding a shortened softball season for GMS students during the fall of 2022. The process and timeline are similar to the ones we went through when you approved middle school golf three years ago, which would place the item as a consider/approve at the May 12 meeting.
 - b. COVID Bonus for Employees: Later in the meeting, the BOE will have an opportunity to allocate federal ESSER III funds for an end of the year bonus for staff as a token of appreciation for their service and dedication over the past 25 months under the additional heavy burden caused by COVID.
 - c. Student Handbooks: Each Leadership Team has made recommendations for changes to the student handbooks, marked in strikethrough and red language to easily see the changes. Some positive changes place an emphasis on bringing accuracy to grades and the ability for students to demonstrate their highest level of academic achievement through reassessment opportunities. This will be a first reading.
 - d. Geneseo Education Foundation spring grant cycle gift to the district: The GEF has generously awarded approximately \$50,000 worth of grants to staff. I am excited about the creativity and passion of our staff to provide unique learning experiences for our students.
