LOST AND FOUND

Students should check in the Principal's Office and Welcome Center for lost items. Any items found should be turned in to the Principal's Office or to the School Resource Officer.

MOMS WHO CARE ROOM

The Mom Who Care (MWC) Room is located behind the gym in the former dance room. Moms Who Care is a community outreach program that helps students achieve success at Limestone Community High School by meeting essential needs such as hygiene products, school supplies, food items, and clothing. There is no cost to the students as the program is run entirely through community donations. Students interested in receiving Moms Who Care assistance should see their guidance counselor.

PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE

The Principal's Office is in the east corridor of the first floor and houses the offices for the Principal, Assistant Principal, and the Athletic Director.

SNACK BAR

Snack items and drinks may be purchased in this area. Food and drinks purchased in the Snack Bar must be consumed in the Snack Bar. The Snack Bar is open during all lunch hours, after school, and during most athletic events. Waste is to be placed, not thrown, in the containers. Students should clean their tables before leaving the Snack Bar area.

WELCOME CENTER

Every student or visitor arriving to Limestone after 7:45 a.m. must enter the building using Entrance 19, the cafeteria doors off the student parking lot, where they will be buzzed in by the Welcome Center attendant. The following protocols are in place to make our campus as safe as possible for students, staff and visitors.

- Parents dropping off or picking up their students or items for their students, such as homework or uniforms, after 7:45 a.m. will need to use the student parking lot at the corner of Airport and Pfeiffer Roads. Items will be left with the Welcome Center attendant.
- 2. Delivery personnel will need to check in at Entrance 19 before delivering elsewhere.
- 3. Students arriving after 7:45 a.m. must sign in at the Welcome Center.
- Visitors must sign in at the Welcome Center where they will receive a pass to wear while in the school.

FINANCES

FFFS

Limestone District 310 operates on a flat fee basis, meaning that a fixed amount is paid for textbook rental and other items. The 2017-2018 fee is \$125 per year, which can be paid on a yearly basis or \$62.50 per semester. The yearly fee for the second child of a family is \$100 and \$75 per year for each additional child in the family. The semester charge would be half of these rates. The flat fee includes books, participation in music and sports activities, general classroom equipment, and specific classroom supplies. Driver's Education fee is \$125 for the Behind the Wheel portion of the course. As stated, textbook rental is included in the flat fee, but each text becomes the responsibility of the student. If a textbook is lost or damaged, an additional cost will be assessed to the student for repair or replacement. The flat fee does not include insurance, admission to school activities, stock and material for student projects in shop, art, and family and consumer science classes, yearbook purchases, padlocks, class rings, senior graduation fees, or other specific student fees. Certain classes may require the purchase of a workbook or material that students will keep at the end of the course or consume over the period of the course. Late entrants will be charged a proportionate share of the flat fee. Students dropping from school can receive a refund determined by the length of the enrollment; however, there is no refund after the mid-point of a semester.

FEE WAIVER

A fee waiver may be obtained by completing a free/reduced lunch application, which is available in the Business Office. Approval is based on income eligibility guidelines set annually by the Federal school lunch program. Only students approved for free/reduced lunches will have book fees and Driver's Education Behind the Wheel fees waived. Laboratory fees, shop fees, workbook costs, damaged textbooks fines, and library fines are not included in the fee waiver process and are still the responsibility of the student's parent

Required Phyical Examinations

Parents are reminded that students entering Pre-school, Kindergarten, sixth and ninth grades, or when transfering from an out-of-state school into an Illinois School, are required to have a physical examination prior to the start of school. Students in Kindergarten and students new from out of state must have a vision exam by October 15. Dental exams are required for students entering grades Kindergarten, Second and Sixth, and must be submitted by May 15.

Students participating in sports must have an athletic physical completed by a licensed physician and must be turned in prior to tryouts (including cheerleading and poms). This physical is good for one year from the date of the exam.

Physical examination forms are available at all the schools and may be picked up at any time or are available on the district web site.

REGISTRATION FEE

Each student pays a \$115.00 yearly registration fee. This fee is paid during registration at the beginning of each year. **There will be no refunds.**

The fee pays for the use of all student textbooks and computer lab usage for the year. Students are expected to exercise care in handling their books and when using the computer labs. Those who do not care for their books properly or lose them must pay an additional fee for damage or loss. Also, students may need to purchase consumables for various classes (i.e. workbooks).

In addition, certain special classes require fees or the purchase of special equipment (industrial arts, science, art, driver's education and others). Please refer to the course descriptions for fees.

CHARGES FOR LATE REGISTRATIONS:

No reduction in fees for the 1st quarter.

25% reduction in fees for the 2nd quarter.

50% reduction in fees for the 3rd quarter.

75% reduction in fees for the 4th quarter.

The school establishes fees and charges to fund certain school activities. Some students may be unable to pay these fees. Students will not be denied educational services or academic credit due to the inability of their parents or guardians to pay fees or certain charges. Students who parent or guardian is unable to afford student fees may receive a fee waiver. A fee waiver does not exempt a student from charges for lost or damaged books, locks, materials, supplies and/or equipment.

Applications for fee waivers may be submitted by a parent or guardian of a student who has been assessed a fee. A student is eligible for a fee waiver if at least one of the following prerequisites is met: 1) The student currently lives in a household that meets the free lunch or breakfast eligibility guidelines established by the federal government pursuant to the National School Lunch Act; or 2) The student or the student's family is currently receiving aid under the Article IV of the Illinois Public Aid Code (Aid to Family of Dependent Children). The building principal will give additional consideration where extenuating circumstances may exist.

The Board of Education allocates resources to maintain a quality education for the students of our community. Customized learning opportunities for students are provided to our students.

In order to provide these customized learning opportunities, the Board of Education has set fees to offset the cost of providing these programs and services which students receive. It is important to balance those fees with the state of the local economy and the amount of support received by the District from the State of Illinois.

Student Registration Fees

Families are responsible for paying a student registration fee to offset the costs for consumable instructional materials for each student enrolled. The fees for the 2017-2018 school year are as follows:

Waiver of School Fees

Students will not be denied education service or academic credit due to the inability of parents/guardians to pay fees and charges. Students whose parents/guardians are unable to afford fees may request a <u>waiver</u>. Applications for fee waivers may be submitted by a student's parent(s)/guardians(s) who have been charged a fee.



Student Fees

The Board of Education allocates resources to maintain quality schools for the community in part by offering activities, programs and services for students that extend beyond the State of Illinois' required minimum level for a free public education.

In order to provide these additional programs and services, the Board has established fees to be paid by the participant in order to offset the costs of providing such programs and services.

Student Registration Fees

Families are responsible to pay a student registration fee to defray costs for consumable, instructional materials for each child enrolled in school during the current school year as follows:

• Pre-Kindergarten: \$60

• Kindergarten: \$135

Grades 1st - 5th: \$155

Grades 6th – 8th: \$140

Grades 9th - 12th: \$168.50

Refunds are issued on a prorated basis if the student is dis-enrolled.

Other School Fees

Individual schools may establish other fees based on their programming. School fees noted as "required" are subject to the District's waiver policy. "Optional" fees are not subject to the waiver policy.

Required school fees include course fees, PE uniforms, etc. If a student participates in an extra-curricular activity, additional required fees may be assessed.

Examples of optional fees include technology device protection plan, calculators, yearbooks, admission to social events, or travel for recreational activities.

Students will be charged for library fines and other costs incurred as a result of loss, misuse, destruction or replacement of school property.

Financial Assistance

Students will not be denied educational service or academic credit due to the inability of parents/guardians to pay fees. Parents/guardians unable to afford school fees may apply for a Waiver of School Fees. Payment plans are also available.

Special Note for Freshmen:

Freshmen are not required to have a separate sports physical in order to participate for BHS athletics. The regular school physical that is required to enroll in high school satisfies this requirement. This is the only document that Freshmen do not need to turn in.

Directions for Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors:

Sophomores through Seniors, must have a current physical on file in order to participate. A physical is good for 13 months, any physical older than 395 days is invalid and will not be accepted.

- check made out to Batavia High School (\$154.00) and dropped off to the Athletic Office at Batavia High School

Please note that solely paying for athletic fees **does not** fully register your son/daughter for athletics at BHS. The above three steps must also be completed in order to fully register your son/daughter for athletics at BHS.
