Updates from around the district and the state.

- 1. Thursday, February 13, 2025 marks our 111th day of student attendance. As a reminder, due to the Emergency Day used on Jan. 21, school will now be in session on Feb. 17 (Presidents' Day).
- With your approval last month, we've posted our known certified openings for the 2025-26 school year and have started to promote them with social media posts on <u>Jan.</u> <u>16</u> and <u>Feb. 3.</u>
- Also on the employment front, members of our admin team will be attending a variety of college job fairs, including Western Illinois University's annual education career fair on Feb. 28, 2025, Illinois State's job fair on Mar. 4, 2025 and the Northern Iowa job fair on Mar. 7, 2025.
- Congratulations to the six Geneseo High School students who <u>earned All-State Band</u> <u>honors.</u> The students were among 1,500 selected by the Illinois Music Education Association to participate in its 2025 All-State Student Programs in Peoria, Illinois from Jan. 29-Feb. 1.
- 5. Winter sports seasons are nearing their end and soon the spring sports will begin. Recently, the GHS Boys' Wrestling team won the always competitive Geneseo Invitational, claimed the Western Big 6 championship, and honored Head Coach Jon Murray for his 23 years of coaching and retirement at the end of this season.
