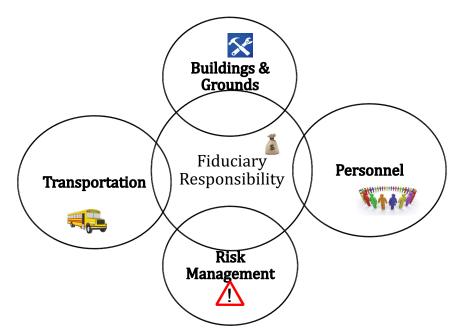
Updates From Around the District and the State January 10, 2019

- Mr. Mackey, Mr. O'Dell, and their building counselors are working on a plan to redefine what it means for a Geneseo student to be College and Career ready under the The Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness Act (PWR). I am excited about some of our initial talks and I believe they will be presenting to the Board at the April meeting.
- Mr. Kashner has presented to you today about the benefits our Preschool program provides to the district. I am making an appeal to you today to consider making the financial commitment to our neediest students by maintaining our preschool program for another year. <u>Research</u> shows that for every \$1 spent on preschool, it saves the nation \$8 in future expenses for remediation or worse, rehabilitation. We cannot afford not to fund it.
- 3. In August of 2018, EEOC filed a lawsuit against Urbana School District charging age discrimination due to a provision in its collective bargaining agreement which allegedly limits increases in salary during the last ten years preceding an employee's retirement. The purpose of such limitation, of course, is to prevent retirement system penalty to the school district, but EEOC charges that such a provision, which means a late career employee is entitled to a smaller increase in salary than an early career teacher, is illicit age discrimination.
 - a. While the case does not directly ask the question whether a teacher retirement salary enhancement incentive is violative of the law, it is conceivable that the outcome of the case may have broader impact. Particularly as districts grapple with the now lower "3%" threshold imposed by Public Act 100-587, it is important for school districts to consider the effect of a salary threshold limitation which may have an impact on late-career teacher earnings.
- 4. The GEF, at December's meeting, asked for an update on the Sherrard memorial plaque/recognition request. We have an agenda item to give GEF representative, Mr. Ash, feedback on how to proceed.
- 5. The TLT have an excellent day of inservice training planned on January 21, including topics dealing with homework, Conscience Discipline, Ed Leaders Network, and setting academic targets. I am also meeting with office personnel from across the district to go over some new ideas for 2019. It should be an impactful day for staff.
