WE MADE IT. Another very unique but all to familiar year is now in the record books. There are so many things to be excited about as we close another chapter in the history of District 228. I know you are fully aware of what this year has been like on many levels. As this is the last board report I will write, please allow me one more opportunity to highlight the year of our nursing staff. I have been so blessed to have worked in a school district for 30 years and have been touched by the professional nursing staff since day one. The current nurses in the district continue the tradition as they too are professional, compassionate, caring and very knowledgeable. They treat our students, staff and families with respect, compassion and caring attitude in a completely professional manner.

We ended up starting the year with the 2 new nurses. We were lucky to be able to hire Sara Kreps, our new sub from last year for the position at Millikin. Jessica Jansen was hired for the Middle school with the plan for her to take over the head nurse position. Both nurses have been a wonderful addition to our staff and have made the transitions to their new position look smooth and effortless. The entire nursing staff dealt with the return of our normal office activity but faced several months of intense COVID increases. In total the nurses saw over 23,000 students in our offices while contact tracing over 2200 staff and students with COVID related issues. They continued to give exceptional care as they waited for IDPH guidelines to appear or not to appear. Their calm attitude and assessment skills got them through when guidelines weren't available. Our nursing staff is an amazing group of women that complement the already outstanding District 228 admin and staff. As I write this last report, we say good bye to another of our long-time nurses. Helen Johnston has given us 15 years at Northside caring for some or our smallest children. She has been a very important part of the life at Northside for many years and will definitely be missed.

We welcome to our staff next year Erinn Richmond at the high school and Heidi Brumbaugh at Northside. Both nurses are exceptional nurses and individuals and will be great additions to our staff. Jessica Jansen at the middle school will take over as Head Nurse.

In closing I would just like to thank the Geneseo School District Board members, administrators, staff, students and families for 30 years. I have loved being a part of this family. There have been days of frustration, anger, sadness and disappointment but those make the other days of joy, happiness and excitement so sweet and rewarding. I look at it this way. I went to school every day as if entering an amusement park. Each day I would get on a ride. I never knew what ride I was going to be on or how long I'd be on it. It made each day interesting. Thank you for allowing me to get on the ride each day.

### STATE ISSUES:

IDPH, ISBE, ROE, OEM and HCHD continue to update guidelines regarding COVID and the practices that are to be implemented with-in the schools.

NARCAN- the use of Narcan in our schools was promoted with Narcan being made readily available after the nurses had training.

# **COMMUNITY CO OP**: Athletic Physicals.

20-21- It is our goal to once again work with area providers to be able to offer Athletic physicals for our students in 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

21-22 We worked with the Regional Health Partners on a limited basis to provide 146 Athletic physicals in May 2022.

## **REVIEW of GOALS FOR 2020-2021**

The nursing team will continue to work together to provide the opportunity for all students to learn in a safe, caring and professional environment. We will remain flexible, professional, caring and compassionate nurses while providing health services to our students, staff and district families.

Update 21/22: This goal was met this year as we worked together as a team with students, staff and families with the changing guidelines for COVID. The nurses remained courteous, professional and caring while dealing with tough situations during the COVID pandemic.

### Technology goal:

We will be adaptable to online registration by being flexible and open minded as how it relates to obtaining health information on our students

Update: State required records are uploaded to Skyward during registration for new students and all grade levels that have medical, dental or visual requirements. Uploading of previous years documents to the cloud and Skyward is still being done until we get caught up. Uploading the documents will provide an easier, less time-consuming task when searching for an Alumni's requested immunization documents.

State Goals: The nursing staff will be knowledgeable and implement as needed state mandates and changes in state guidelines.

Update: We will continue to keep a close eye on COVID and the IDPH guidelines if we enter another outbreak.

Narcan: Training of all nurse to be able to give Narcan in the event of an opiate overdose. Narcan will be made available to all school to have one dose on hand through the OEM.
