Voxitatis qualifies for a fee waiver as news media: the organization operates as a news service, disseminating information to the public regarding schools via a Web site, published continuously since 2003. See 5 ILCS 140/2(f). The purpose of this request is to access information on the welfare of the public schools with regard to fine arts education and support.
